Seminar

- 1. Use literary present tense!

Meter: Order of Operations

- **Polysyllabic words:** where is the stress usually? Consult a dictionary if you really don't know.
- **Monosyllabic words:** nouns and verbs are usually stressed. Pronouns and interjections sometimes are – you can play with these to fit a pattern. Prepositions, conjunctions, and articles are rarely stressed.
- **Scansion:** the act of annotating the stressed and unstressed syllables in poetry. / and U above the syllables; | to separate feet (see white board)
- Things that are **different** stand out, right? So imperfect meter draws the attention to certain words.

Other types of metric feet

- Iamb U /
 - Trochee / U
 - Spondee //
 - Anapest U U /
 - Dactyl / U U
