

MLA Works Cited Information

1. Start each entry with the author's name. Last name, First name. (No author? Move on to the title.)

Sifferlin, Alexandra.

2. Then ask yourself: is the article part of a bigger website?

Yes: Put the article title in quotation marks. Then the title of the website italicized.

“Eat Nuts, Live Longer.” *Time.com*.

No: Italicize the title of the article.

Julie Andrews Biography.

3. List the copyright date (Day Month Year).
4. Type the word Web.
5. List the date you accessed the site (Day Month Year).

6. Evenly double space entries.
7. If an entry carries onto a second line, indent the second line.
8. Pay attention to the punctuation in the following examples.
