- 2. Come up with a list of examples from the book, especially Ch. 6-10, that support your assessment of each character's personality. **Include page numbers.**
- Example: Billy Bones demands people be quiet and listen when he's in the mood to sing or tell stories. Bones has Jim keep an eye out for a one-legged man and fears the return of Black Dog.
